





The limit for any single grant is **\$5,000**. Grants can be to individuals or to organizations that serve blind and visually impaired individuals. Only one award per year per person/organization will be given. Those who have received prior funding will receive lower priority than first-time applicants.

Application deadline is May 15, 2020. Awards will be announced in June, 2020. Awardees will be invited to attend the Lions District 4-C3 Convention in May, 2021 to be recognized and honored. Awardees must give a final accounting of how funds were used, and be willing to have their testimonials used for publicity purposes by LVRN.


